#### **TEXT I – Let's Bake Sugar Cookies**


Nobody is actually sure who created the very first cookie. But the first cookie may be a mistake. Many cooking experts believe that a long time ago cooks who wanted to test the temperature of their ovens would bake a small amount of cake pastry to find out if the oven was hot enough to bake an entire cake. These test cakes were called keokje, which means "little cake" in Dutch. Dutch immigrants who came from the Netherlands brought the recipe to the United States. Our word cookie may have come from their word keokje. Cookies were also very popular in England, but the English call them biscuits, as do Australians. Almost every country has a word for cookie. In Spain, they are called galletas, and in Italy, cookies are called biscotti. Americans must not be the only people who enjoy cookies.


